Town of Mount Desert: Covid Update

June 22, 2020 / 4 pm / Town Manager's Office

The Town of Mount Desert expects residents and visitors alike to abide by CDC and State recommendations for mask wearing, social distancing, quarantine, isolation, and handwashing. Abiding by these recommendations will help protect our island community.

Governor Mills announced some alternatives to quarantine for Maine:

- Residents of New Hampshire and Vermont may come to Maine without quarantining, effective June 12th.
- Beginning June 26th, Maine can welcome all visitors who provide a recent negative covid test, in place of 14 day quarantine.

The Governor's order requires Maine people to wear cloth face coverings in public places where physical distancing is difficult to maintain, as recommended by the U.S. CDC. The order identifies public settings as:

- Indoor spaces that are accessible to the public such as grocery stores, retail stores, pharmacies and healthcare facilities
- Outdoor spaces such as playgrounds, busy parking lots, and other areas such as lines for take-out service where the public typically gathers in a smaller area
- Public transportation such as a taxi, Uber, Lyft, ride-sharing or similar service
- Ferry, bus, or train
- Any semi-enclosed transit stop or waiting area
- Under the order, cloth face coverings are not required for children under age 2, a
 child in a child care setting, or for anyone who has trouble breathing or related
 medical conditions, or who is otherwise unable to remove the mask without
 assistance.

*Maine currently requires all visitors and returning residents to quarantine for 14 days through June 26th.

The State of Maine is offering financial support for those families impacted by the pandemic. If your child(ren) qualified for free or reduced lunch during the time they were in school (August-March), you should qualify for the Pandemic EBT (electronic banking) card. The Pandemic EBT offers \$5.04 per student in the household per day.
