Town of Mount Desert: Covid Update

Sunday, June 7th at 2:00 pm

MDI High School will host its Graduation Ceremony in the gym parking lot at the High School followed by a parade through the communities in which our graduates live. Parade plans to come.

The Town of Mount Desert expects residents and visitors alike to abide by CDC and State recommendations for social distancing, quarantine, isolation, and handwashing. Abiding by these recommendations will help protect our island community.

- Retail stores are now permitted to be open to the public.
- On Monday, May 18th restaurants are permitted to seat customers inside.
- Governor Mills says reservations may be accepted for occupancy starting June 1 for Maine residents and non-residents who comply with the state's 14-day quarantine requirement. <u>Click here</u> to read the full press release from Governor Mills.

The Governor's order requires Maine people to wear cloth face coverings in public places where physical distancing is difficult to maintain, as recommended by the U.S. CDC. The order identifies public settings as:

- Indoor spaces that are accessible to the public such as grocery stores, retail stores, pharmacies and healthcare facilities
- Outdoor spaces such as playgrounds, busy parking lots, and other areas such as lines for take-out service where the public typically gathers in a smaller area
- Public transportation such as a taxi, Uber, Lyft, ride-sharing or similar service
- Ferry, bus, or train
- Any semi-enclosed transit stop or waiting area
- Under the order, cloth face coverings are not required for children under age 2, a child in a child care setting, or for anyone who has trouble breathing or related medical conditions, or who is otherwise unable to remove the mask without assistance.

*Maine Requires all visitors and returning residents to quarantine for 14 days.

Public Safety, Municipal & Hancock County News

All municipal buildings, schools, restrooms, and playgrounds remain closed to the public.

*The Main Street construction project is due to end on May 22nd and will resume again in October.

*The Municipal Offices will be closed for Memorial Day on 5/25. As a reminder, there will be no Town sponsored parade or cookout this year.

The EOC, Emergency Operations Center, has suspended regularly scheduled meetings and will resume as necessary.

*Report of Emergency Operation Center Staff Briefing: May 12, 2020

The EOC will remain activated at a level 3, which is designated as a "Standby" status as defined in the Town's Emergency Operations Plan (EOP), until the end of day, Tuesday, May 12th. The Local Emergency Management Director (LEMD) will continue to monitor the spread of COVID-19 in our area and the State.

The briefing was attended via teleconference by the Town Manager, Police Chief, Harbormaster, Public works Director, Northeast Harbor Ambulance Service's (NEHAS) Service Chief, LEMD/Fire Chief, Town Clerk and Treasurer.

The EOC briefing began with a quick overview of confirmed cases in the State. It was noted that the reported infection rate continues to increase overall and varies in degree from day to day. As of this briefing, the number of cases in Hancock County remains at 10. The LEMD reminded

staff members that this will most likely be our last weekly briefing unless a surge or second wave should affect our area.

The EOC staff was asked to provide an update of their current situation and their operational objectives and any resources needed to complete those objectives. The overall readiness or ability to maintain operations within the town government has changed little since the last EOC staff meeting. Below is each staff members report:

- <u>Town Manager (TM)</u> The Town Office is currently still in lockdown. Right now, the goal is to try and open the Town Office for business on June 1st. Department staff have been meeting weekly to discuss plans to reopen the customer service area of the Town Office. Issues such as adhering to appropriate distancing, customer flow and establishing work station(s) are items that are being evaluated. Extended work hours or setting up an appointment system are other possibilities being considered.
- <u>NEHAS</u> Little change for the NEHAS. Two staff members on duty for 24 hour shifts, 7 days a week will remain through August. The Service Chief expects an increase in calls in the coming weeks, which is typical during the summer season. The unknown is will there be an increase in COVID-19 related cases as well. Daily cleaning and disinfecting procedures will continue as will monitoring of staff's health to prevent possible infection spread.
- <u>Police Chief</u> The Chief reports that his department will begin shifting to the normal summer schedule which will increase staff numbers to coincide with increase in seasonal activities. The renovations at the Bar Harbor PD and dispatch areas are entering its final stages. Inquiries regarding quarantining and stay-at-home orders are continuing to be fielded. Staff and management have continued their education campaign in regards to Governors Mills Executive Orders.
- <u>Treasurer</u> No changes to report within the department. Staffing level and schedules are the same. Additional PPE supplies have been acquired in preparations of the office opening.
- <u>Public Works Director (PW)</u> The Public Work Director reports that staff will begin returning back to its normal schedule and daily operations. Employees will be briefed on proper social distancing guidelines and, if not possible, the wearing of masks. Yearly seasonal work such as routine yard work and line painting on town-owned streets and parking lots will begin soon.
- <u>Harbormaster</u> Harbormaster reports that seasonal staff has already started, or will soon be starting at the marina. The Harbormaster and Deputy Harbormaster will go back to their normal schedule beginning next week. Procedures are being worked out to comply with social distancing guidelines while opening. Plexiglass barriers will be installed in the office area of the Harbormaster's building for employee/customer protection.

- <u>Fire Chief</u> No significant change in operations within the Fire Department. The Chief said he plans to discontinue the present 24/7 staffing as of May 17th. The fire department portions of the Seal Harbor, Northeast Harbor and Somesville stations will remain locked down. PPE inventory is stable and should last through the summer. Chief said that extra precautionary measures will be taken when responding residents with known or suspected out of state occupants.
- <u>Town Clerk</u> Town Clerk indicates little or no change since last week. As was
 reported by the TM, preparations have begun to allow public access to the Town
 Office within CDC guidelines. There was some discussion on the upcoming elections
 and what the arrangements would be needed at the Somesville fire station.

The EOC was activated in March to act as a command center for monitoring and directing the Town's emergency response to the public health threat from the COVID-19 virus. The LEMD considers the current public health threat as minimal and therefore the EOC's purpose fulfilled and sees no longer the need for it to remain active. The Town's continuity of essential municipal functions is stable and the demand for resources, response coordination, and all identified incident management objectives, have been met. Deactivation does not mean that the presence of COVID-19 has been eradicated or that people are no longer at risk of infection, but rather the transition for the each department from EOC activation to more routine, long-term activities to protect employees and community members from the threat of the virus.

Island Explorer

Downeast Transportation, in consultation with its partners, has decided to indefinitely postpone Island Explorer bus system service for 2020 due to the COVID-19 pandemic. The Island Explorer is a propane-powered, fare-free transit system that serves Acadia National Park and the surrounding communities. In 2019, the bus system carried more than 648,000 passengers. Service would normally begin June 23rd on Mount Desert Island and Memorial Day weekend on the Schoodic Peninsula, and run through Columbus Day.
