March 8, 2022 Special Town Meeting Proposed Warrant Articles for Appropriation of 20 Funds, Ordinance Amendments, and Ordinances (Note: LUZO ordinance articles had 21 public hearing on 1/19/2022) 22 23 24 Chair Macauley asked for public comment. 25 Finance Director Wright explained, that with regard to Article 9, the Board agreed to use 26 27 bonding at a previous meeting. Bond Counsel was unable to obtain bids within the time frame needed for this meeting. Confirmed estimates have been provided in their place. 28 The estimates are conservative, using a 20-year term and an interest rate of 3.5%.
